

(Annual Report: January to December 2021.)

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INTRODUCTION

During 2021, we were still fighting for the challenges of the pandemic, due to which we realized the largest number of activities online. In an effort to be responsible for both ourselves and our project partners, we assessed the situation each time and accordingly organized activities either online or hybrid or live in compliance with prescribed epidemiological measures. After the summer the impact of the pandemic weakened and happy because of that, we organized a number of live events to enable representatives of partner institutions and organizations to live happily and work together after almost two years of online communication.

The TPO Foundation has achieved remarkable results through its long-standing programs of the ETOS initiative, SAPERE BH and Socrates Cafes, but has also launched two new programs UNIGEM (Universities and Gender Mainstreaming) and FER (Feminism and Religion) online schools in cooperation with the Ecumenical Women's Initiative from Omiš.

They managed to implement trainings, educations and campaigns in cooperation with permanent partners in schools and universities with the aim of strengthening intercultural and interreligious competencies of teachers, thinking skills and teaching techniques in BH, Montenegro, Croatia and Serbia.

We have certified another group of trainers for SAPERE BH who can transfer knowledge according to the P4C method and start cooperation with the Ministry of Education of Sarajevo Canton on accreditation of SAPERE BiH program as one of the important programs that teachers will be able to apply and introduce critical thinking methods and techniques. their educational process.

Socrates cafes continued at five universities with current topics that young people discussed today by applying Socrates' dialogue methods, which include the art of asking questions to get to the truth.

During the pandemic, we continued to provide psychosocial support to teachers, students and young people to more easily overcome the period of isolation and learn how to deal with stress.

Through the UNIGEM program, they established a network of cooperation with 17 universities in BH, Serbia, Croatia and Montenegro, and at the end of the year, the University of Belgrade joined us. In a very short period of time, gender equality bodies were established at 18 universities, the Gender Action Plans (GAP) were adopted and a number of activities were implemented during the 16 Days of Activism campaign at these universities. In the 16

Days of Activism campaign, they participate every year in secondary and primary schools that are permanent partners of the TPO Foundation.

We are especially proud of the online FER school we launched in the fall as a pilot. It quickly became apparent that there was a great need to talk about women's rights and gender equality from a secular and religious perspective.

In cooperation with the embassies of Austria, France and the Goethe Institute, which coordinate the EUNIC program, we piloted a project on minorities called "My story is important" and our partners were organizations from Serbia, Montenegro and Macedonia.

We were honored to co-organize the promotion of the book published by Routledge Press "Healing and Peacebuilding After War" in cooperation with the University of Denver, which is the result of the International Conference on "Trauma, Memory and Healing" organized by TPO Foundation with world universities. It is always interesting to talk about the film, and this year we had the opportunity to do so with groups of students, pupils and activists from local communities. In collaboration with the Embassy of the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland on the occasion of International Women's Day, we realized 3 online discussions about the film Jennifer Siebel News called Miss Representation.

Research - Assessments in the field of education, human rights, gender equality, dialogue, and peace building with the purpose of preparing adequate policies and specific project activities, always taking into consideration gender perspective and specificities of the cultural context.

Gender equality - Promotion and implementation of local and international standards on gender equality through various types of education and raising awareness about these issues in local communities. Special focus is on development of local gender-inclusive communities that respond to the needs of both women and men.

Public Advocacy - Advocacy for changes in action policies and adoption of new policies with the aim of developing a democratic civil society and gender equality, but also raising awareness of the society about the importance of active involvement and participation of citizens in decision making processes. Advocating for gender sensitization of BiH legislation.

Capacity Building - Empowering individual capacities of women and youth, as well as organizational capacities of local organizations, in areas of gender equality, human rights, economic empowerment, dialogue, and peace building. Support to education reform, health

care, and social rehabilitation by training professionals and promoting user's initiatives, and providing psychosocial support to women, children, and youth.

Intercultural Dialogue - Promotion of intercultural dialogue, peace building, and reconciliation in cooperation with relevant NGOs, both national and international. Organization of public debates, round tables, and workshops, as well as meetings of artists, academics, and NGO activists capable of providing respective solutions for common action and co-existence. Organization of meetings in small local communities with the aim of gathering representatives of divided communities in BiH and opening a dialogue.

- Over a hundred teachers have been empowered to deal with stress during the pandemic through online psychological help channels.
- Certified group of TOT trainers from high schools from three cantons within the SAPERE BH program (Philosophy for Children).
- Cooperation has been established with the Institute for Social Innovation of Montenegro within the project "ETOS Balkans World ETOS in my school".
- Over 30 primary and secondary school teachers from Croatia, Serbia and Montenegro were educated for ETOS values.
- Empowered over 700 students and over 300 teachers for ETOS (ethics of tolerance, openness, solidarity) values in seven schools in Tuzla Canton and Sarajevo Canton.
- Over 1000 students were educated for philosophical questions using the method of Socrates 'dialogues through 20 Socrates' cafes in Tuzla, Mostar, Zenica, Sarajevo and Banja Luka.
- Cooperation has been established with 18 universities in Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia, Croatia and Montenegro within the project "Introduction of Gender Mainstreaming in Higher Education / University and Gender Mainstreaming (UNIGEM)".
- Gender Action Plans (GAPs) adopted at 18 universities within the UNIGEM project.
- Gender Equality Councils established and promoted at 18 partner universities within the UNIGEM project.
- Conducted research on gender-based violence at universities in four countries Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia, Montenegro and Croatia, within the project Introduction of Gender Awareness in Higher Education (UNIGEM) -10 in-depth interviews and 5000 online surveys with students, teachers and teachers and administrative staff.
- The global campaign "16 days of activism against gender-based violence" was marked by teaching staff and student groups from a total of 17 universities in Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Serbia and Montenegro, within the UNIGEM project.

- Established international cooperation with the SAPERE Institute in London, the University of Colorado, Stanford University, the Tübingen Institute in Germany and the Comon Bond Institute in America.

PROGRAM 1. ETOS INITIATIVE

Within the ETOS Initiative, a series of activities was held through the EMIL (Empowerment for Multireligious and Intercultural Learning) project, which is a continuation of the ETOS activities



from previous years. The EMIL project had two key activities to promote ETOS values, namely: Strengthening intercultural and interreligious competencies and ETOS Balkan trainings, through which the ETOS initiative expanded its network of teachers in the Balkan region.

1.1 A TWO-DAY BALKAN ETOS SEMINAR MODULE III - CULTURE OF TOLERANCE AND NONVIOLENCE

The ethos of tolerance, non-violence and openness towards others is especially important today when we have as a challenge, not only a large number of conflicts, but also a pandemic that has further isolated people from each other. In January 2021, the TPO Foundation held the third seminar of the Ethos of the Balkans in cooperation with colleagues from Croatia, Serbia, Montenegro and Bosnia and Herzegovina. The seminar was opened and moderated by v.prof.dr. Zilka Spahić Šiljak, and the leaders were Sedžida Hadžić, M.Sc., and Miroslav Bagara, M.Sc., the guest lecturer was Alen Kristić.

1.2 PSYCHO-SOCIAL SUPPORT PROGRAM FOR TEACHING STAFF OF BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA LAUNCHED

The TPO Foundation has launched a program of psychosocial empowerment of teachers with the aim of providing adequate support in overcoming the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic. How important is it to be aware of your personal capacities, skills and abilities when it comes to the challenges caused by a pandemic? Why should we never suppress emotions and why should we talk about them? These were some of the questions we tried to answer during the first two sessions of the planned twenty sessions dedicated to the teachers of the program "Psychosocial Support in Facing the Challenges Caused by the Pandemic". Through simple exercises on thinking about their own capacities, the participants of the sessions had the opportunity to strengthen their emotions and observe the challenges of the pandemic in a different way. Participants in this program are teachers of primary and secondary schools HNK, KS, TZ, ZDK and SBK. The first thematic unit for the two groups of teachers was realized on Monday. Almost 100 primary and secondary school teachers from five cantons had the opportunity to study and talk with psychologist and psychotherapist Nermina Vehabović-Rudež and psychiatrist dr. Amrom Delić.

PROGRAM 2. SAPERE BH

SAPERE (Society for Advancing Philosophical Inquiry and Reflection in Education) is a Londonbased institute that educates teachers in the UK and across Europe and the world according to the P4C Philosophy for Children method. The SAPERE Institute in London has licensed 12 teachers within the



TPO Foundation for Work with Teachers and Children. Philosophy for children P4C is a method of questioning, and is based on:

- thinking about philosophical / big questions and concepts;
- reflection and argumentation that lead to the improvement of thinking skills,
- shaping and changing attitudes;
- fostering questioning skills: critical, creative, collaborative and caring / empathetic thinking for which the English abbreviation 4C (critical, creative, collaborative, caring) is often used.

2.1 "PHILOSOPHY FOR CHILDREN P4C" - II CYCLE OF TRAINING FOR TEACHERS IN SARAJEVO

Within the program SAPERE BIH, in the period from 15. - 16., February, 2021. A two-day training P4C Philosophy for Children of the II cycle for teachers working in high schools in Sarajevo Canton was realized. The goal of the SAPERE BH program is to strengthen teaching staff and their competencies in the field of critical thinking as a method of working with students. Teachers of the Third, Fourth and Fifth Gymnasiums, Dobrinja Gymnasium, Maarif Schools of Sarajevo, Secondary School of Economics, KŠC Gymnasium and Richmond Park College Sarajevo were participants in the second cycle of training to improve critical thinking. PROGRAM 3: UNIGEM

UNiversity and Gender Mainstreaming abbreviated UNIGEM project is a strategic commitment of universities to introduce a gender perspective to ensure gender equality and a safe environment for teachers as well as students at universities in Bosnia and



Herzegovina and the region. The realization of the project goals in the duration of four years envisages a comprehensive research on the state of gender equality at universities before and after the implementation of this project. The UNIGEM project also envisages the establishment of a special body to combat gender-based discrimination at all universities that have signed a Memorandum of Cooperation with the TPO Foundation. The UNIGEM project is being implemented with the support of the Embassy of the United Kingdom in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

3.1 CEREMONIAL SIGNING OF MEMORANDUM OF COOPERATION WITH UNIVERSITIES IN BH AND THE REGION

Within the project UNIversity and Gender Mainstreaming (UNIGEM), TPO Foundation is on October, 06. 2021, with the support of the Government of the United Kingdom in Sarajevo, organized a meeting and signing a memorandum of cooperation between the TPO Foundation and 17 universities from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Serbia and Montenegro. Regional cooperation of universities on issues of gender equality is an indicator of how excellent results are achieved through partnership work. A systematic approach to the introduction of gender equality in universities will help make academic institutions a safer place for all and without discrimination on the basis of gender.

His Excellency, Ambassador Matthew Field, pointed out that: "A survey in BiH shows that more than 60 percent of citizens believe that gender-based discrimination is widespread. For us, it is an indicator that we need to do more in that area, and we will. As for women and girls, this issue remains an important priority for the United Kingdom.

Program Director of the TPO Foundation c. prof. dr. Zilka Spahić Šiljak emphasized that: "It is the moral imperative of all of us to ensure fundamental human rights and freedoms, and this

will not be possible if there is no willingness to change the culture of gender relations, perception of gender roles and power dynamics.

Rector of the University of Sarajevo prof. dr. In his address, Rifat Škrijelj emphasized the importance of this project and said that it was: "Another project within which the University of Sarajevo is happy to participate is dedicated to one, I could say, networking of our universities around a common idea."

In his address to the audience, the director of the Agency for Higher Education and Quality Assurance of Bosnia and Herzegovina, prof. dr. Enes Hašić, and through the video link, words of support were sent by the expert associate of the Agency for Higher Education of the Republic of Srpska, Mrs. Tatjana Radaković, as well as the representative of the University of Rijeka, Dr. sc. Sanja Barić and the director of the department for legal, ethical and issues of inclusion and diversity, Ms. Darija Glavan Šćulac.

3.3 UNIGEM: 16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM - ACTIVITIES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MONTENEGRO

Within the project UNIGEM - University and Gender Mainstreaming, three workshops were held on the topic of gender equality and gender-based violence at the Faculty of Law and the Faculty of Political Science of the University of Montenegro. The first workshop, entitled "Basic levers of patriarchy: Your body is a battlefield" was held on November 12, 2021 in the premises of the Faculty of Political Science, University of Montenegro. The dean of the Faculty of Law of UCG, prof. dr. Aneta Spaić and peace activist Paola Petričević.

The second workshop entitled "The position of women in Montenegrin society: Where we were, where we are now" was held on November 18, 2021 in the Faculty of Law, University of Montenegro. The workshop was held by a doctoral student at the Faculty of Philology, University of Montenegro, M.Sc. Ksenija Rakočević and teaching associate at the Faculty of Law, University of Montenegro, M.Sc. Milena Aćimić Remiković.

The last in a series of three workshops entitled "Gender-Based Violence in the Practice of the European Court of Human Rights" was held on November 25, 2021, also at the Faculty of Law, University of Montenegro. Prof. spoke at the workshop. Dr. Nebojsa Vucinic, retired professor of international law and former judge of the European Court of Human Rights in Strasbourg.

On the occasion of November 25, "International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women", the Student Council of the Faculty of Law of the UNCG announced a competition for the best essay on "Strong identity - a prerequisite for the emancipatory role of women in society." The competition was announced for students of all faculty units in Montenegro, because the diversity of texts and opinions of young people is the key to social change. 3.4 UNIGEM: 16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM - ACTIVITIES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NOVI SAD

Within the 16 days of activism, three workshops were held at the University of Novi Sad (UNS), which promoted issues in the field of gender equality, as well as the fight against gender-based violence. The first workshop was held by a guest lecturer from Denmark, November 12, 2021. year, prof. dr. Hilda Romer Christensen entitled: Gender Smart Mobility and Diversity in Transport, Concepts, Methods, Practices., Who presented the link between gender and smart transport as an important issue in urban metropolises across Europe.

At the University of Novi Sad, students organized three public forums. On the occasion of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, the EU Info Point Novi Sad (EU Delegation Information Corner in Novi Sad) and the University of Novi Sad organized the first panel discussion entitled "Gender-Based Violence and Youth". Participants in the forum: dr. Nada Padejski Šekerović, Safe Women's House, Novi Sad; Sanja Pavlović, Autonomous Women's Center, Belgrade; and Jelena Mirić, activist and student at the University of Novi Sad. The participation of the representative of the "Women's Initiative", student Jelena Miric, in this forum was of multiple importance, because she again presented and promoted the work of the "Women's Initiative" at the Faculty of Philosophy in Novi Sad. competed with the idea to make everyday life easier and study for her colleagues, and she received support. Thus, the Faculty of Philosophy in Novi Sad is the first in Serbia to have free inserts in the toilets of the faculty.

How much do students know about their rights? Do women and men have equal rights and in which social areas? Where is the line between violence and nonviolence? Students of the University of Herzegovina sought answers to these and other questions, led by dr.sc. Martine Primorac, Ph.D. Drage Martinović, M.Sc. Marka-Antonia Brkić, Ph.D. Nataša Šantić. Through the workshop "Legal and Institutional Framework for Gender Equality in Bosnia and Herzegovina", students received basic information about the campaign as well as important international dates that connect women, violence and human rights.

Furthermore, the workshop brought the participants closer to the importance of the Law on Gender Equality in Bosnia and Herzegovina, which laid a good foundation for gender equality, but its application in practice is still limited due to inconsistencies in other regulations. The workshop "Gender Equality in the Social Perspective of the Local Community" aimed to analyze, in cooperation with the participants, statistical data on gender representation in the education system; the number of enrolled students and their achievements in higher education, the representation of teachers by gender and gender representation in research and development.

The Student Union of the University of Herzegovina organized student activities in the form of a series of interactive workshops and artistic performances.

The Artistic Performance activity was held live, in the premises of the University of Herzegovina in Mostar. The performance was led by a student of the Faculty of Social Sciences, dr. Milenko Brkić (University of Herzegovina) - Anja Rikalo. 6. THE FIRST ONLINE FAIR SCHOOL: FEMINISM AND RELIGION WAS ORGANIZED

The Feminism and Religion (FER) school is intended for women and men who want to academically question their beliefs, attitudes, knowledge and practices on



human rights and freedoms and who want to explore how gender stereotypes shape the lives of women and men in family and society. The goal of the FER school is to deconstruct the foundations of gender stereotypes and construct egalitarian gender models that find their foothold in scientific and religious arguments. Classical and contemporary philosophical, theological, historical, sociological and other sources were analyzed using the method of feminist anthropology, historical criticism, hermeneutics of doubt and gender-sensitive linguistics. As part of the pilot phase of the FER school, we opened space for the implementation of four courses: History of Feminism in the East and the West; Philosophy and gender; Gender, religion and peacebuilding; Religion and gender-based violence.
