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INTRODUCTION

In 2024, committed to advancing gender equality, we continuously worked to create more inclusive and equal communities within the education system. Through four key projects, our focus was on promoting gender equality in university and school communities. Activities were aimed at motivating teaching staff, student and pupil populations, but also the wider community, in order to encourage reflection, engagement and concrete actions aimed at reducing gender stereotypes and discrimination. Our efforts in this area contribute not only to educational progress, but also to the creation of a society in which everyone has equal opportunities, regardless of their gender. The TPO Foundation has achieved remarkable results through the following projects: UNIGEM (Universities and Gender Mainstreaming), FER (Feminism and Religion) online school, MENGA (Menstrual and Gender Action) and LOC4SOC (Local Communities for Social Cohesion).

They have managed to implement trainings, educations and campaigns in cooperation with permanent partners in schools and universities with the aim of strengthening teachers' intercultural and interreligious competences, thinking skills and awareness of gender issues in BiH, Montenegro, Croatia and Serbia.

We gathered over a hundred students at the Winter and Summer School on gender and gender issues, educated over 500 police officers on how to deal with cases of gender-based violence, educated over 30 teachers on critical thinking and gender, held a series of Socrates cafes with founder Christopher Phillips on combating gender equality and held Socrates cafes throughout Bosnia and Herzegovina, held a series of discussions Trudbenice u kulturi focusing on women in art, media, literature, entrepreneurship, academic life, acting and music, held a series of workshops on femicide at 19 partner universities, held working meetings with non-governmental organizations on criminal law and the need to introduce femicide, held a series of seminars on the anti-gender movement at partner universities and held promotions of publications on feminism, women's rights and gender equality.

11 secondary and primary schools as well as 19 partner universities participated in the 16 Days of Activism campaign. We are particularly proud of the realization of the first conference entitled Gender and Gender Equality in Cyberspace, which is the first conference in Bosnia and Herzegovina. This interdisciplinary event enabled students to explore through academic dialogue how digital technologies, social networks and virtual spaces shape, but also challenge, gender norms and power dynamics.

ABOUT US

Gender equality - Promotion and implementation of domestic and international standards on gender equality through various types of education and raising awareness of these issues in the local community. Special attention is paid to the development of local gender-inclusive communities in which the needs of both women and men are taken into account.

Public advocacy - Advocacy for policy changes and the adoption of new ones, with the aim of building a democratic civil society, gender equality, but also raising awareness of the public about the importance of active participation in these changes. Advocacy for gender sensitization of the state legal framework of BiH.

Capacity building - Work on strengthening the individual capacities of women and youth, as well as the organizational capacities of local organizations in the areas of gender equality, human rights, economic empowerment, dialogue and peacebuilding. Support for the development of education reform, health care and social rehabilitation, through training of professionals and promotion of strengthening of user initiatives and psychosocial support for women, children and youth.

Intercultural dialogue - Promotion of intercultural dialogue, peace building and reconciliation, in cooperation with NGOs in BiH and in the world that are dedicated to these issues. Organization of public discussions, round tables and workshops on these topics, and meetings of artists, academics and NGO activists, who from their perspective can offer ideas for joint action and coexistence. Organization of meetings in small local communities, with the aim of bringing together divided people in BiH at one table.

- Marked the global campaign "16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence" by teaching staff and student groups from a total of 19 universities in Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Serbia and Montenegro, within the UNIGEM project.
- Implemented UNIGEM follow-up research through surveys and interviews of teaching and administrative staff and student population.
- Held Socrates Cafes in Zenica, Sarajevo, East Sarajevo, Banja Luka and Mostar.
- Educated over 2000 students on gender-based violence through special activities of teaching staff at 19 universities in four countries.
- Empowered over 2000 students through activities within the international campaign "16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence".
- Empowered over 1500 secondary and primary school students against gender-based violence during the campaign "16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence".
- Educated over 50 participants of the online FER (Feminism and Religion) school.
- Educated over a hundred students at the Winter and Summer Schools on gender and gender issues.
- Educated over 500 police officers on how to deal with cases of gender-based violence.

PROGRAM 1. LOC4SOC

Local Communities for Social Cohesion (LOC4SOC) aims to address the issue of anti-immi-

grant sentiments, stereotypes and prejudices among members of the local community, especially among school staff and young people from the municipality of Hadžići through their engagement in scientific research on prejudices, stereotypes and social cohesion, and a series of activities including workshops on interculturalism, anti-bias education, critical thinking, social cohesion and inclusion of people on the move in the local community, using education, sports, art and customs as media for intercultural learning. This project is aimed at the active engagement of a large number of interest groups within the local community.



1.1 THE FIRST TOT TRAINING MODULE FOR STRENGTHENING INTERCULTURAL COMPETENCES IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF HADŽIĆI

In the period from 15-16. January 2024, the first TOT training module was held to strengthen the intercultural competences of teaching and professional staff from four schools in the Hadžići Municipality. The training was led by experts in the field of interculturalism and social cohesion: prof. Ph.D. Jasna Kovacevic, M.Sc. sc. Elmana Cerić, Lejla Đelilović, BA and Mirza Kovačević, BA. The director of the TPO Foundation, prof. Ph.D. Zilka Spahić Šiljak. 21 teachers and professional associates from four primary schools participated in the training: Primary School 6. Mart, Primary

School Hadžići, Primary School 9. May and Primary School Hilmi ef. Saric.

- Primary School 6. mart, by psychologist Arijana Osmanović Štukan and social worker Lejla Fejzić;
- Primary School 9. maj, by teachers Nermina Čomor and Emina Mujić and
- Primary School Hilmi ef. Šarić, by teachers Alisa Šehić Fejzić and Halima Ramić.

What the participants of the ToT training learned and questioned, they passed on to 86 colleagues from their home schools.

The month of Ramadan, as the month of charity, seemed like an ideal opportunity to connect these two groups and learn about each other through a meal.



1.9 PROMOTION OF RESEARCH RESULTS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF HADŽIĆI

After a five-month research in the area of the Municipality of Hadžići, the TPO Foundation presented the results in the publication "Mapping Stereotypes and Prejudices of Adolescents Towards Vulnerable Groups in the Community" on October 16, 2024, at the premises of the Primary School "6. mart", authored by Prof. Dr. Zilka Spahić Šiljak and Prof. Dr. Jasna Kovačević. The research was conducted by members of the project team: Jasna Kovačević, Mirza Kovačević, Lejla Đelilović and Nejra Džananović. As the final event within the project "Local Communities for Social Cohesion", the TPO Foundation, in



addition to promoting the research results, also presented the Handbook "Using Comic Book Methodology in Strengthening Intercultural Competences and Social Inclusion in Teaching" by authors: Jasna Kovačević, Mirza Kovačević, Lejla Đelilović and Jasmin Šehović.

PROGRAM 2: MENGA

TPO Foundation implemented a project called Menstrual and Gender Action - MENGA. The main idea of the project is to lobby for the reduction of the so-called 'pink tax'. Also, the implementation of a project on this social issue is unthinkable without the participation and support of the state. Therefore, we discussed with government representatives about access to menstrual hygiene products at universities in Bosnia and Herzegovina and in general about the abolition/reduction of



taxes on menstrual products. The main goal was to enable better access to hygiene, sanitation and menstrual products used during women's menstrual cycles. In addition to monitoring the city budget allocated for menstrual supplies, a special advocacy plan was developed to target decision-makers and relevant faculty staff. Together with university researchers, a survey was conducted with female students in Bosnia and Herzegovina on menstrual poverty.

2.1 MENGA RESEARCH RESULTS PRESENTED TO REPRESENTATIVES OF THE AUTHORITIES AND UNIVERSITIES

On 18.03.2024. A publication was published that presents the results of the research entitled

"How much does it cost and how much does it hurt: Social decoding of menstruation at universities in Bosnia and Herzegovina", as part of the MENGA project. This publication presents the results of a five-month research conducted at eight public universities in Bosnia and Herzegovina, in which female students and teachers participated. The MENGA research is the first research of this type conducted in Bosnia and Herzegovina. The first presentation of the results was held for representatives of government agencies, non-governmental organizations and representatives of the University of Sarajevo.

PROGRAM 3: UNIGEM

UNiversity and Gender Mainstreaming, abbreviated as UNIGEM, represents the strategic commitment of universities to ensure gender equality and a safe environment for teachers and students at universities in Bosnia and Herzegovina and the region by introducing a gender perspective. The realization of the project objectives over a period of four years also foresees a comprehensive research on the state of gender equality at universities before and after the implementation of this project. The UNIGEM project also envisages the establishment of a special body to combat gender-based discrimination at all universities that have signed a Memorandum of Cooperation with the TPO Foundation. The UNIGEM project is being implemented with the support of the Embassy of the United Kingdom in Bosnia and Herzegovina.




biases – both those stemming from biological and neurological factors.





In 2021, the TPO Foundation and the Ecumenical Initiative of Women (EIŽ) from Omiš launched the first online FER school in the Balkans. The leaders of the FER school are v. prof. Ph.D. Zilka Spahić-Šiljak and others. sci. Jadranka Rebeka-Anić, and the School is intended for everyone who wants to academically question their beliefs, attitudes, knowledge and practices about human rights and freedoms and who want to investigate how gender stereotypes shape the lives of women and men in the family and society.





4.1. FAIR SCHOOL - NON-ACA-DEMIC PROGRAM


In the Summer Semester 2024 (February-June), five non-academic courses were held for the general public: Feminism is an absolute curse, 2. And you, good sister, keep quiet - gender-based violence, 3. Is peace a woman's thing, 4. Is a woman a man, 5. The Eastern Girl of Feminism.

Lecturers from Ljubljana, Zagreb, Zadar, Banja Luka, Saraje-

vo, Belgrade, Tuzla, Zenica, Mostar and East Sarajevo were hired. The school was attended by 67 participants.

At the end of the semester, certificates were awarded to participants at the Center for Interdisciplinary Studies of the University of Sarajevo.





4.2. FER SCHOOL - ACADEMIC PROGRAM

FER School has become part of the Lifelong Learning Program at the Center for Interdisciplinary Studies of the University of Sarajevo and from the Winter Semester 2024-2025. students have the opportunity to receive ECTS if they fulfill their obligations. During this semester, FER School was attended by 75 students divided into five courses: 1. History of Feminism, 2. Gender, Religion and Gender-Based Violence, 3. Gender, Religion and Media, 4. Gender, Religion and Peacebuilding, 5. Gender and Philosophy.




4.3. FER SCHOOL - PODCASTS






5.1 TPO FOUNDATION PUBLISHED THE PUBLICATION "HOW MUCH DOES IT COST AND HOW MUCH DOES IT PAIN? SOCIAL DECODING OF MENSTRUATION AT UNIVERSITIES IN BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA"

As part of the MENGA project, the TPO Foundation published a publication entitled "How Much Does It Cost and How Much Does It Hurt? Social Decoding of Menstruation at Universities in Bosnia and Herzegovina". The authors of the publication have worked hard on the research in the past period, and on 58 pages you can find interesting data on menstrual poverty in Bosnia and Herzegovina. This research is structured in four chapters: Introduction, Sociocultural Aspects of Menstruation: Coding and Internalizing Stigma and Shame, Economic Aspects of Menstrual Poverty and Policy Recommendations. The survey was conducted on a sample of 699 female students and 127 female teachers. In the qualitative phase of the research using semi-structured interviews, a total of 42 respondents were interviewed, namely 22 female teachers and 20 female students from public universities in Bosnia and Herzegovina.



5.2 TPO FOUNDATION PUBLISHED THE PUBLICATION "ANI RAJS RADOŠEVIĆ – POET OF A MOVEMENT"


TPO Foundation has published the book "Ani Radošević, Poet of a Movement" by Saida Mustajbegović. This is a biographical and first book about the opera director and a kind of testimony of Balkan, but also European politics and art in the nine decades of her life. The story of this exceptional artist, born in 1915 in České Budějovice, is interwoven with well-known and lesser-known historical events in the era that the Czech Ani Rajs alias Radošević lived. Ani Radošević lived art and worked for the common good. She actively participated in the creation of art history, but did not give it a personal touch. She was a co-founder of the Sarajevo avant-garde group Collegium Artisticum 1939-1941; member of the People's Liberation Theatre, which played on the front lines, and in Jajce during the second session of Avnoj; she founded the secondary ballet school in Belgrade, Lujo Davičo, etc.



5.3 TPO FOUNDATION PUBLISHED THE PROCEEDINGS OF GENDER JUSTICE DISCOURSES: ANALYSIS OF LEGAL FRAMEWORKS AND CASE LAW IN BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA, CROATIA AND SERBIA


The Proceedings of Gender Justice Discourses: Analysis of Legal Frameworks and Case Law in

Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia and Serbia was created as a result of a two-year research effort as part of the UNIGEM project implemented by the TPO Foundation in cooperation with 19 partner universities in Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia and Serbia. The research began with an invitation to all members of the academic community – including professors, doctoral students, as well as scholars from the humanities, social sciences and especially legal sciences, as well as all activists working in the field of combating gender-based violence - to analyze criminal judgments issued in cases of gender-based violence from a critical scientific perspective, with a focus on sexual violence, domestic violence and femicide. The research that resulted in this compendium was initiated to better understand and address the deep-rooted gender stereotypes that often shape judicial decisions.



5.4 TPO FOUNDATION PUBLISHED THE PRO-CESSION "GENDER AND VIOLENCE IN THE BALKANS"

The collection of texts "Gender and Violence in the Balkans" presents a comprehensive analysis of gender-based violence and the broader impact of gender issues in Balkan society. The collection is the fruit of the work and reflections of the participants of the Winter School "Gender and Violence" held at the University of Novi Sad, who developed their texts with the mentoring support of their professors. This collection not only documents the key insights that shaped the Winter School program, but also includes discussions during it, and deepens the understanding of the complex connections between gender, gender identities and various forms of violence that society reproduces and tolerates. Through different approaches and perspectives, the authors explore how gender manifests itself in different spheres of social life – from public spheres such as law and politics, through education, science, culture and art, to deeply personal and intimate aspects of life.



5.5 TPO FOUNDATION PUBLISHED A BOOK OF ESSAYS ON CRITICAL-PROGRESSIVE IS-LAM

The book was published in a Bosnian translation to be a resource for FER (Feminism and Religion) but also for a wider readership. The author, prof. dr. By embracing this perspective, Muslims can contribute positively to the global community, fostering understanding, harmony and progress. A progressive Muslim worldview serves as an affirmation of Islam's resilience and adaptability, allowing it to continue as a vibrant and dynamic faith that is inclusive of different cultures and responsive to the evolving needs of humanity.



5.6 TPO FOUNDATION PUBLISHED A PUBLICA-TION USING THE COMIC METHODOLOGY IN STRENGTHENING INTERCULTURAL COMPE-TENCES AND SOCIAL INCLUSION IN TEACHING

From January to August 2024, the TPO Foundation implemented the Local Communities for Social Cohesion project with the support of the International Organization for Migration (IOM). The aim of this project was to build stronger and more connected local communities through the education of teachers and young people from primary schools, the promotion of tolerance and inclusiveness, and the encouragement of active participation of all community members. Eighth grade students and teachers from four primary schools in the Hadžići Municipality (four selected experimental classes) as well as children from the Temporary Reception Center Ušivak participated in the project activities. One of the activities was a comic book making workshop, and students and minors from the Ušivak PPC created comics within the following topics: discrimination, peer violence, mod-



esty and empathy. This publication aims to introduce teachers to the usefulness of using comics as a teaching method. It explains the advantages of using comics as a teaching method and provides examples of how to integrate comics as a method into different subjects.

5.7 TPO FOUNDATION PUBLISHED A PUBLICATION MAPPING ADOLESCENTS' STEREO-TYPES AND PREJUDICES TOWARDS VULNERABLE GROUPS IN SOCIETY

Within the framework of the LOC4SOC project, the TPO Foundation, with the support of the International Organization for Migration, conducted a survey on the attitudes of adolescents towards minorities, especially migrants. The aim of the survey was to examine the presence of stereotypes and prejudices and to determine what is needed to achieve social cohesion of minorities. The survey was conducted in two phases. The first phase, the baseline survey, mapped the attitudes of adolescents from primary schools towards minorities, in order to determine whether and what kind of stereotypes they have and to what extent they know and accept others and those who are different. After that, educational, cultural and sports activities were carried out with the aim of sensitizing adolescents, teaching and professional staff to intercultural competences. After the completion of these activities, the survey was repeated in order to determine whether there had been a change in the attitudes of adolescents and their readiness to accept people from other cultures.



5.8 TPO FOUNDATION PUBLISHED THE PUBLICATION "LAURELS FOR A WOMAN'S HEAD: THE GENDER DIMENSION OF LITERARY AWARDS IN BIH"

Although most recent research and reports on the position of female artists and cultural workers


emphasize that some progress has been made in the last ten years, a large number of them still face various forms of gender-based discrimination. This is reflected in various mechanisms and practices: from weaker support for the production and distribution or presentation of their artistic works, to the fact that they are often made more difficult, and sometimes completely denied, access to stable sources of financing and the labor market. Although the number of women professionally engaged in cultural institutions and the creative industry is generally very significant, highly qualified women in the field of culture are still paid less than men, more often work in poor working conditions, and rarely occupy key management positions. For the purposes of this study, data was mostly collected based on a search of archival materials from various institutions (from cultural societies, cultural centers at the municipal level, ministries of culture at the cantonal and entity levels, theaters, and publishing houses or cultural event boards) and media articles.



5.9 TPO FOUNDATION PUBLISHED THE PROCESSION "GENDER AND ART"

After the Winter School held at the University of Tuzla in 2024 as part of the UNIGEM project, students, with the mentorship of selected professors, prepared their final academic and artistic works, which were collected in the Proceedings Gender and Art. The Proceedings were edited by

Jasmina Husanović, Anisa Avdagić. Selma Veseljević Jerković and Maja Dedić. The works intervene in the critical production of knowledge about artistic practices and works from the perspective of gender theories, in an interdisciplinary and intersectional key. The works represent interesting interdisciplinary approaches to the topics of gender and art with different voices and perspectives of young people from the Balkan region. The uniqueness of the Proceedings is the connection between academic discussions and practical work that address issues of gender stereotypes and gender-based violence and offer space for different readings and interpretations of art and gender equality.





5.10 TPO FOUNDATION PUBLISHED A PROCE-DURE PROCEDURE OF STUDENT PAPERS "GEN-DER AND GENDER EQUALITY IN CYBER SPACE"

Cyber space offers opportunities for empowerment, but also space for perpetuating gender stereotypes, violence and inequality. Precisely because of this, the inclusion of young researchers in these discussions represents an extremely important step towards understanding global trends and their local context. Male and female students, as the generation of the digital era, bring fresh perspectives on these topics, pointing to the complexity of the digital society, but also to the possibilities for positive changes. Their works, based on research and reflection, are not only an academic contribution but also a call to action for the wider community. The collection consists of eight papers that, together with an appendix, provide a comprehensive insight into the ways in which the digital world can be both a source of challenges and opportunities for promoting gender equality. The editors of the collection are Nejra Džananović and Ivana Kulić.

5.11. TPO FOUNDATION PUBLISHES THE ANTHOLOGY MONOTHEISTIC THREE VOICES

This is the third edition of this publication since 2009, jointly published by the **TPO Foundation** in collaboration with **Rabic d.o.o.** and the **IMIC Center** for the purpose of interreligious and intercultural dialogue in schools. The publication provides an overview of key historical, cultural, and religious information, beliefs, and practices in the three monotheistic religions: **Judaism, Christianity, and Islam**, and it has been printed as part of the **FER School** program.





6. ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES

6.1 VIDEO MATERIALS RELATED TO COMBATING GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

As part of the UNIGEM project, five new videos were created, which were created in cooperation with a practicing expert, Dr. Nermin Šehović, spec. iur. The titles of the videos are: Current situation regarding gender-based violence in BiH, Evidence in cases of violence or femicide, Femicide in BiH and the criminal procedural framework, How to recognize femicide and Procedure upon reporting violence. 6.3 THE WORK OF THE UNIVERSITY GENDER RESOURCE CENTER (UNIGERC) WAS PRE-SENTED TO THE COMMISSION ON GENDER EQUALITY OF THE PARLIAMENT OF BIH

The film presents several key activities that universities in the Balkans have implemented during the Campaign and shows how important it is to look out for and support survivors and victims of gender-based violence.



6.6. FILM "THROUGH SPORTS AGAINST GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE"

This film was created as part of the 16 Days of Activism Campaign with the aim of including men as allies in the fight for gender equality. Given that prominent sports figures in BiH have shown interest in being part of this story, the film's authors: Mirza Kovačević and Jasna Kovačević created material in which, in addition to statements from athletes and journalists, they also offered a narrative about the social, economic and health implications of gender-based violence.



6.7 RESULTS AND ACTIVITIES OF THE UNIGEM PROJECT PRESENTED AT THREE UNIVER-SITIES

Last week, three partner universities of the UNIGEM project held meetings at which they implemented previous activities, as well as plans for the future. Thus, on December 19, 2024, the Institute for Philosophy and Social Theory (IFDT) of the University of Belgrade (UNBG) held an online meeting with the membership of the UNBG Gender Equality Committee. The meeting was attended by four members of the Committee, two of whom are from the Rectorate's professional services, and two from UNBG organizational units. On this occasion, the achievements of the UNIGEM project this year and plans for the coming months were presented. Additional important information is that the new annual action plan (for the period until 2028) is currently in procedure and should soon be adopted by the UNBG Senate.
